HAKONE GROUP TOUR/TEA CEREMONY GUIDELINES

Hakone is the oldest Japanese and Asian estate garden in the Western Hemisphere, established in 1915. It is one of the prime landmarks by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. It is an authentic replica of Japanese Samurai or Shogun's estate garden, designed by one of the descendants of the imperial gardening family members. We appreciate your respecting the serenity and tranquility that Hakone Estate and Gardens offers. Please observe the following guidelines.

1. Please call the Event Office at 408-741-4994 ext.103 to confirm that the date and time requested is available. Office hours are 9 AM to 5 PM, Monday through Friday.
2. **NO BUSES LONGER THAN 30 FEET ARE ALLOWED.** Due to sharp turns and the steep grade of the entry road, vehicles larger than 24 passenger busses are prohibited. Buses longer than 30 feet may be parked at the base of the drive up way (Big Basin Way). There is a hiking trail (1/4 mile) that visitors may walk from Big Basin Way to the Gardens.
3. Open hours are 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday, and 11:00 AM through 5:00 PM Saturday and Sunday. All docent tours and tea ceremonies must be completed during these hours.
4. Please arrive 15 to 20 minutes (depending on the size of your group) prior to your scheduled time to pay the fees at the Gift shop, collect, and organize your group together. Tours and Tea Ceremony each take 45 to 60 minutes, depending on the size of your group.
5. Because paths and walkways are covered with either gravel or rock, the Gardens have a limited access to wheelchairs.
6. Please wear comfortable clothes and walking shoes. Be prepared to remove shoes and sit on the floor if you are having a ceremony in a Tatami room. A pair of socks is always required to be worn on the Tatami mats.
7. Children should be supervised at all times, preferably at least one adult per five children. Please have them refrain from running around, shouting, or kicking the gravel, so that other visitors who come to experience the tranquility won't be disturbed, and can enjoy as well. Please do not throw any objects into the Koi pond, including coins. These delicate fish and turtles suffer as a consequence.
8. Docent guides are dedicated and are unpaid volunteers. Please appreciate their time and efforts.

Thank you for adhering to these guidelines. We hope that your visit to Hakone will be an enjoyable, unique, and pleasant experience.
